For 2014-15, the estimated increase in funds for supplemental and concentration funding will be used district-wide due to the high percentage of unduplicated pupils that the district serves. The funding source and amounts are listed in section 3 and indicate the source and amount budgeted for these items, and is included in Exhibit A that exceeds the proportional supplemental and concentration amount of \$12,174,259 for the 2014-2015 fiscal year.

The increase in funds is based on the unduplicated % of enrollment in the Grade spans as well as the enrollment of low income, foster youth, and English learner students. Porterville Unified School District will expend these funds based on an evaluation of current student needs and then procure services, trainings, and other supplemental services to help underachieving students perform at grade level.
