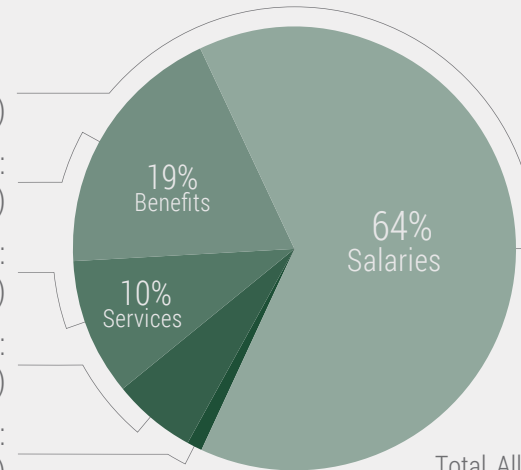

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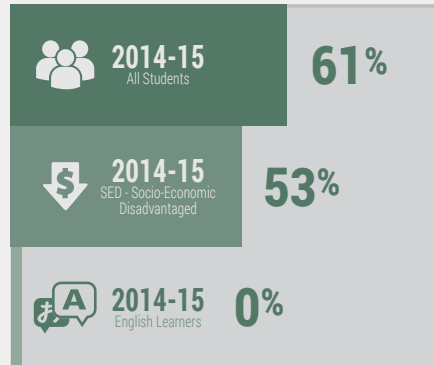

### HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATION RATES



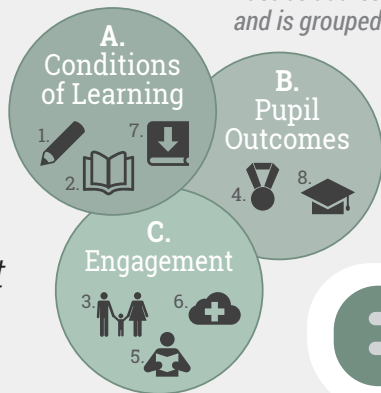
### A-G COMPLETION RATES
