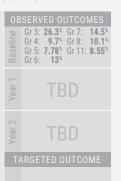


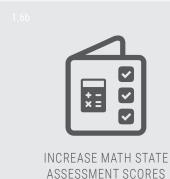




INCREASE MATH STATE ASSESSMENT SCORES

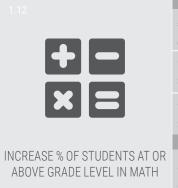


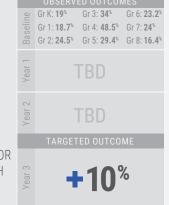
















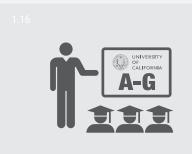


INCREASE % OF ENGLISH LEARNERS RECLASSIFIED AS RFEP

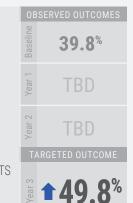
