


Stakeholder feedback helped guide the creation of the Learning Continuity Plan & many different groups participated in the development process:

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SAFETY MEASURES



Limited Campus Access Schools will restrict non-essential visitors, volunteers, and activities involving other groups.





Frequent Cleaning Surfaces and facilities in the school will be cleaned and disinfected frequently.

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Key Points

Elementary Schools

- Daily live video conferencing with students will take place to provide instruction, explanation of daily work, and to answer questions.
- **Small group**, progress monitoring, or individualized instruction will occur.
- Asynchronous Instruction occurs throughout school day as teachers work with small groups and intervention groups.

Example 2 Secondary Schools

• **Daily instruction** will include synchronous (live) & asynchronous (independent) activities.

Key Points

Elementary Schools

- On-campus, in-person instruction occurs 5 days per week, two and a half hours per day, in the AM or PM.
- Asynchronous learning occurs during the AM or PM session when students are not physically at school.

Example 7 Secondary Schools

- On Mondays, all students do virtual learning to launch the week's instruction.
- •Students are divided into two groups, reducing in-person class sizes by 50%.
- **Using videoconferencing**, teachers provide instruction to both in-person & online students simultaneously.







- Learning is conducted 100% online, 5 days per week.
- **Personalized, flexible**, and supportive online education.
- Project Based Learning.
- **Course offerings** will include Honors, AP, CTE, EL and special education.
- **High School courses** are approved for UC/CSU admission and NCAA eligibility.



Health & Safety Supplies - Purchase health & safety supplies including additional staff to support cleaning protocols.	^{\$} 750,000
Extra Duty Hours - Provide additional extra duty hours for increased supervision and safety.	\$300,000
Health & Safety Supports - Purchase personal protective equipment, additional cleaning supplies, and provide other health	^{\$} 500,000
and safety supports.	
Desk Dividers - Purchase desk dividers to provide additional safety for students while in class.	^{\$} 528,094
Additional Staff - Hire additional staff including a custodian to support health & safety.	^{\$} 200,000

Foster Youth & Pupils Experiencing Homelessness are monitored weekly and staff have been trained in re-engagement strategies.



EL Instructional Staff - Provide extra duty hours for teachers and EL instructional staff to support English Learner students.	\$300,000
Chromebooks - Purchase and distribute 12,000 chromebooks to help reduce the digital divide and enable all students to fully	\$4,000,000
participate in distance learning programs, especially foster youth, English Learners, and students in poverty.	
Internet Connectivity - Enable all students to participate in virtual learning by purchasing hot spots and providing internet	^{\$} 256,000
connectivity for students without internet at home.	
Canvas Learning - Purchase & implement Canvas Learning as a learning management system to provide a virtual learning	^{\$} 77,750
space for teachers and students to deliver and participate in instruction.	
Instructional Materials - Purchase instructional materials including Teacher Editions, Student Online editions, etc.	^{\$} 425,000
CTE Virtual Machine Software - Purchase CTE Virtual Machine Software which can help reduce the need for additional	^{\$} 100,000
equipment and allow students to learn the required course competencies safely.	
Music Education - Purchase a 3-year license for the SmartMusic music education software.	^{\$} 49,000



Addressing Pupil Learning Loss

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Diagnosing and addressing pupil learning loss will be a primary focus in 2020-21 following school closures in Spring 2020.

LEARNING LOSS STRATEGIES

- Diagnostic assessments will be conducted upon student's return to help identify gaps in learning. • Action Plans will be developed for struggling students to help reduce learning gaps.
- Teachers work collaboratively to assess data & plan instruction..

MEASURING EFFECTIVENESS

- Tier II Intervention program effectiveness will be monitored using student data collected in the i-Ready and IXL diagnostic assessments.
- District personnel will meet with teachers to determine which actions and strategies are successful.

During hybrid learning, nutritionally appropriate meals will be provided at all school sites.




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Safety Measures
